



Coronavirus (COVID-19) Summer Schools Programme Funding – Cheadle Hulme High School

Why?

Covid 19 brought so much disruption to the usual Cheadle Hulme Sixth Form Year 12 academic experience both inside and outside the classroom that we felt that a Summer School was too good an opportunity to miss.

How?

We used Summer School in two ways:

- (1) To provide face-to face A Level subject-specific support to Year 12 students
- (2) To provide support to Year 12 students intending to apply to Oxbridge through enrichment activities

What?

Subject-specific support entailed at least 6 hours of small-group tuition by subject teachers who were revisiting content covered in Year 12. Across nine days we delivered sessions in the following subjects:

- Spanish
- Physics
- Geography
- French
- Design and Technology
- Psychology

Oxbridge application support involved a 3-hour Masterclass focusing on Presence given by the Laurus Trust Head of Voice to prepare students for the challenge of online interviews in December.

There was also a residential trip to Corpus Christi College, Oxford. Students met with Oxford students and the outreach team to discuss personal statement preparation and admissions tests. They also had the opportunity to visit other colleges and academic departments, and the Ashmolean Museum.

Use of Funds

Cheadle Hulme High School was eligible for £7,343 based on the attendance data gathered during the programme. This covered the running costs of the programme and we have not claimed for any unrecoverable costs. The funds were used as follows:

- Programme delivery **£5.6K**
- Enrichment activities **£1.4K**
- Programme administration **£0.4K**
