Note from the Director of Sixth Form

This is the last newsletter in what has been a very busy half term. The written exam season is ongoing and support is always available in Sixth Form throughout the exam season if required. We have held another Core Maths revision session in preparation for the exam which has also taken place this week. The Study Centre remains opens until 6.00pm each day for private and independent study. As a reminder, Year 13 students should return their locker key to Sixth Form reception after their last exam – thank you! The deadline for making Firm and Insurance choices on the UCAS Hub is Thursday 5th June; a small number of students have yet to confirm their choices; this must be done in advance of the deadline otherwise the offers will be withdrawn.

Thank you to all the parents/carers who attended the Year 12 Information Evening on Tuesday which focused on the preparation for the Year 12 internal exams and the process for making a UCAS or Degree Apprenticeship application. During form time on Friday, students used the OSCAR platform to record information regarding their subject choices and super-curricular activities. Students were also asked to record their initial subject choice(s) to enable a reference writer to be allocated.

This week we have been looking at London as a possible university destination; some of our Year 12 students visited London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) and attended workshops which focussed on the humanities and social sciences subject strands. They also visited the Tate Modern gallery and enjoyed some free time in Covent Garden. This was a fantastic opportunity for students to discover more about studying in London. We have also welcomed Imperial College, London into Sixth Form on Wednesday; Imperial has a world-class reputation in science, engineering, business and medicine. Students taking STEM subjects have taken part in a session to find out more about studying at the university and life in London; they also found out about the wider opportunities within STEM subjects.

We were pleased to welcome Lorna Havercroft into Sixth Form on Friday for our Laurus Launchpad session. Lorna delivered a really interesting presentation on careers in Business Consultancy and Construction. We are really grateful to her for giving up her time and for being so inspirational for our students.

School closes for half term on Friday and re-opens on Monday 2nd June when A Level exams continue. We hope that Year 13 students are able to balance their revision with some rest and relaxation during the holiday. We would like to wish you all a very pleasant half-term break.
